1	Insufficient Instruction/Supervision	Participants/ other site users	Medium	<p>Sessions to be run by suitably qualified/experienced Instructors or leaders who have read and understood the risk assessment.</p> <p>Ensure there is enough space between participants where equipment is thrown or rolled. I.e., circus skills, highland games, molky etc.</p> <p>Be vigilant of any entanglements, i.e., parachute games, diabolo strings, tug of war etc.</p> <p>Activities to only take place in area prescribed by Bonaly instructor.</p>	Low
2	Faulty equipment	Participants	Medium	All equipment to be checked on each use and inspected on a monthly basis.	Low
3	Injury from manual lifting of equipment	Participants	Medium	Leaders to supervise participants while moving heavy equipment, I.e., Highland Games barrels, giant Jenga blocks when in crate etc.	
4	Friction injuries	Participants	Medium	Leaders to brief participants to “let go” of a rope if it starts to slide through their hands. Pay particular attention to Tug of war (Highland Games), Toxic Waste (Problem Solving) and the Unexploded Bomb (ESCAPE!)	
5	Hypo/Hyperthermia and exposure	Participants	Medium	Instructor to ensure participants have appropriate clothing for the prevailing conditions and to monitor participants during the session.	Low
6	Medical conditions that could affect the activity	Participants	Medium	Instructor to check with group if there are any medical conditions/Injuries which may affect their participation.	Low
7	Slippery/uneven surfaces and trip hazards	Instructor & participants	Medium	Instructor to make participants aware of conditions underfoot.	Low

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Standard Operating Procedure – All Activities

Supervisors will be given copies of Standard Operating Procedures and Risk Assessments for the activity.

The safety of participants is at all times the responsibility of the supervisor.

The supervisor must:

Read and comply with the Standard operating procedure, Risk Assessment and activity instructions.

Complete the sign out sheet before using the activity.

Must supervise the activity for its entire duration and not hand over responsibility to any other person at any time.

Ensure there is adequate first aid provision.

Maintain adequate group control at all times.

Ensure participants are suitably attired for the prevailing weather conditions and activity.

Be aware of any participant medical conditions that may affect the activity.

Make participants aware of conditions underfoot.

Fully brief participants on the activity, paying particular attention to risks highlighted in the Risk Assessments and Standard Operating Procedures.

Report any loss or damage to the equipment/activity.
