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Standard Operating Procedure – All Activities

Supervisors will be given copies of Standard Operating Procedures and Risk Assessments for the activity. The safety of participants is at all times the responsibility of the supervisor. The supervisor must: Read and comply with the Standard operating procedure, Risk Assessment and activity instructions. Complete the sign out sheet before using the activity – Self led. Must supervise the activity for its entire duration and not hand over responsibility to any other person at any time. Ensure there is adequate first aid provision. Maintain adequate group control at all times. Ensure participants are suitably attired for the prevailing weather conditions and activity. Be aware of any participant medical conditions that may affect the activity. Make participants aware of conditions underfoot. Fully brief participants on the activity, paying particular attention to risks highlighted in the Risk Assessments and Standard Operating Procedures.

Standard Operating Procedure – Nightline

Instructor: Bonaly in house Trained and Assessed.

Ratio: The Instructor participant ratio will not exceed 1:12

Risk Assessment: The Instructor is required to be familiar with the site-specific risk assessment and run the activity to these standards.

Site Induction: Site-specific training and assessment.

Instructors will gain instructing experience and familiarisation with the site-specific risk assessment by working with other instructors until assessed as competent.
